

SCHOOL BOARD POWERS AND DUTIES

The Board of Education is the governing body of the school district. The Board is entrusted with the responsibility of developing policies under which the district is managed.

The powers and duties of the Board are as stated in the Education Law and other applicable New York State Laws.

Complete and final authority on all district educational matters, except as restricted by law, will be vested in the Board. Only members of the Board, including the President, have a right to vote on resolutions being considered.

The Board may also enter into contracts and agreements in conformity with state law.
